- T. "Residence Number" means the number designating a residence in the Declaration or any amendment thereto.
- U. "Residence Owner" means the person or persons owning a residence in fee simple absolute and an undivided interest in the fee simple estate of the common areas, limited common areas and facilities in the percentage determined pursuant to this Declaration. Residence owner also means co-owner or owner.
- V. "Unit" shall mean "apartment" or "residence" and shall also mean and comprise the separate numerically identified residences which are designated in Exhibit "B" in this Declaration, excluding, however, all spaces and improvements lying beneath undecorated and/or unfinished inner surfaces of the perimeter walls and floors, and above the undecorated and/or unfinished inner surfaces on the ceiling of each Unit, and further excluding all spaces and improvements lying beneath the undecorated and/or unfinished inner surfaces of all interior bearing walls and/or partitions, and further excluding all pipes, ducts, wires, conduits and other facilities running through any interior wall or partition for the furnishing of utility services, to the residences, common areas, limited common areas and facilities, except:
- (1) all wallboard, plasterboard, plaster, paneling, tiles, wallpaper, finished flooring, and any other materials constituting any part of the unfinished surfaces thereof are part of the unit, and all other portions of the walls, floors, or ceilings are part of the common elements:
- (2) if any chute, flue, duct, wire, conduit, bearing wall, bearing column, or any other fixture lies partially within and partially outside the designated boundaries of a unit, any portion thereof serving only that unit is a limited common element allocated solely to that unit, and any portion thereof serving more than one unit or any portion of the common elements is a part of the common elements;
- (3) subject to the provisions of paragraph (2), all spaces, interior partitions, and other fixtures and improvements within the boundaries of a unit are part of the unit;
- (4) any doorsteps, stoops, porches, balconies, patios, and walled-in areas appurtenant to a unit and all exterior doors and windows or other fixtures designed to serve a single unit, but located outside the unit's boundaries, are limited common elements allocated exclusively to that unit.
- (5) a garage is part of a unit. Garage doors, hinges, locks and any apparatus for opening and closing garage doors are limited common elements allocated exclusively to the unit.
