RULES AND REGULATIONS OF GRACELAND CEMETERY DEVELOPMENT CO., INC.

BOOK 1151 PAGE 851

1. RULES COVERNING CENTETERY LOT OWN-ERSHIP. Lots purchased in Graceland Cemetery are conveyed by Warranty Doed to the purchaser for his family and heirs, as a burial place forever.

In order that the Corporation may have a correct record of ownership of all lots where a re-sale and conveyance is made, it is required that the recorded deed shall be presented at its office so that a record of the transfer can be made. A fee of \$7.00 will be collected before any transfer of ownership is made on the Corporation's records as to ownership of lots.

Where a lot is purchased and an extension of time is granted by the Corporation for payment, the Corporation retains ownership of the lot until all charges due it are paid, and the Corporation reserves the right to remove the remains which may be interred on the lot, to a smaller lot equal in value to the amount paid on the original, or to a single grave in the event that a default occurs in the agreed payment.

An order in writing is required of the lot owner whenever a grave is to be opened, contuining the name, age, sex and residence of the deceased, and a permit from the Board of Health must be shown the Superintendent of the grounds before interment is made. If interment is to be made in the forenoon, application must be made before 2 o'clock p. m. on the previous day. If in the afternoon, by 9 o'clock a. m. on the same

Lut owners shall at once notify the Corporation of any change in his or her post office address or name.

No disinterment shall be allowed except upon order of the Executive Officers of the Corporation, and upon the written order of the owner or owners of the lot, and in every case can only be made under the supervision of the Superintendent.

The Corporation shall have the right at all times to enter upon each and every lot for the purpose of maintaining, cleaning, and policing it.

The Corporation from time to time may lay out or alter such avenues or walks, or make such rules and regulations for the government of the grounds as it may deem requisite or proper to promote the general objects of the cemetery.

No consent or approval of the Corporation shall be valid or binding unless the same shall be in writing over the signature of an Executive officer.

2. RULES GOVERNING WORK DONE AT CEM-ETERY. All orders for work should be left with the Superintendent who is located on the Cemetery property. Employees are forbidden to accept orders for work and are not allowed to accept fees, payments of any sort, or tips.

No lot owner shall have the right to have the stall be and the sta

No lot owner shall have the right to have shrubs and plants cultivated in any portion of the lot, except upon consent of the Corporation. In the event permission is granted, all work to be done under the direction of the Superintendent and to be paid for in cash before work is done. If any shrubs, plants or trees situated in any lot shall become detrimental to adjacent lots or avenues or unsightly or inconvenient, or interfere with the proper crie of the cemetery, the Corporation, by its authorized representatives or employees, shall have the right to enter the said lot and remove the said trees or shrubs or such parts thereof as they shall determine to be detrimental, unsightly, or inconvenient. No owner shall be permitted

to put any covering such as crushed stone or foreign substance, on any grave or lot. No coping or other means of marking boundaries of lots or graves can be used except corner stones as provided. No sign indicating a lot or wall is "For Salo" will be permitted in the ceme-

No improvement shall be made or monument, efficy, or structure erected and no object or inscription shall be used or placed in or upon any lot without the consent of

the Corporation.

No work of any character will be done upon any lot except by cemetery employees or by some person authorized in its behalf, and no lawns, trees, shrubbery, structures, improvements, enclosures, or excavations shall be put, placed or dug upon any lot except by the cemetery employees as directed by the Superintendent.

The grade of all lots, lawns, and avenues as established, or changed, from time to time, by the cemetery and all improvements put or placed upon any lot shall not be altered or changed except by the cemetery.

No trees, shrubbery, or plants shall be placed upon or removed from any lot or pruned, except with the consent of the Corporation, but the Corporation shall have the right, from time to time, to plant, transplant, remove, or prune trees, shrubbery and plants upon said lots.

The Corporation reserves to itself the entire control of every tree, shrub, or vine, growing within the cemetery enclosure, whether planted by the lot owner or otherwise, including the right of removal when it considers such removal advisable.

Trees will not be removed to make advisable burial senace.

The Corporation will use reasonable care in examining trees and removing those apparently in unsound and dangerous condition or unsound and dangerous limbs and branches of trees, but it expressly disclaims responsibility for damage either to persons or property resulting from falling trees or parts of trees.

No flowers or ornaments or objects shall be kept upon any lot after the same shall have become withered, soiled, or unsightly, and in case of the fallure of the owner of any lot to remove any such flowers or other unsightly objects the Corporation shall have the right to remove the same and in no case will the Corporation be responsible for anything placed on lots or graves.

No baskets, glass, crockery, wire, metal arches, watering pots, glass case, covering, box containing artificial flowers, or any sort of receptacle for flowers, except such as are sunk below the surface of the lawn for the grave or lot and all such as are not sunk below the surface of the lawn for the corporation.

3. RULES FOR VISITORS AT THE CEMETERY, e cemetery will be open from seven o'clock a, m, to

sunset.

No firearms, refreshments, or intoxicating liquors, shall at any time be brought upon any lot or in any portion of the cemetery; provided, however, that firearms may be used and discharged in case of a military funeral or on a regular appointed Memorial Day or other

No bird or animal shall be killed, wounded, trapped upon, nor shall any animal or the exgs of a bird be removed from any lot or from any road, walk parkway except by the Corporation, DOGS ARE NALLOWED.
