KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that Furman University, Grantor, in consideration of One (\$1.00) Dollar and other valuable consideration paid by the Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority, hereinafter called the Grantee, receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, does hereby assign to the Grantee, its successors and assigns, the following described rights of way:
