hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell all the  
above mentioned plantation or tract of land containing two hundred and  
twenty acres unto the said Henry Linderman together with all and single  
as the houses, out houses, edifices, buildings barns, Stables, yards, gardens,  
orchards, Woods, underwoods, timber, and timber trees, meadows ponds, lakes  
fishings, ways, Waters, Water courses paths, passages, liberties, privileges, profits,  
hereditaments, Rights, members, and appurtenances whatsoever there  
to belonging or in any wise appertaining, and the Reversion or Reversion  
Remainder and Remainders, Rents, Issues, and profits thereof and of every  
part and parcel thereof, **To have and to hold** the said plantation  
or tract of land containing two hundred acres of land, with every the  
premises, and appurtenances thereunto belonging, unto the said Henry  
Linderman his heirs Executors administrators and assigns, from the  
day next, before the day of the date of these presents, for and during as  
unto the full end and term of one whole year from thence next Ensuing  
and fully to be completed and ended Yielding and paying therefore unto  
the said Hance Black the Rent of one pecker Corn on the last day of the  
said term if the same shall be lawfully demanded, to the intent and pur
