To have and to hold the said tract of one hundred acres of land more or less as aforesaid with every of the hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging unto the said Thomas Sampford his heirs and assigns for ever in free and common socage to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Thomas Sampford his heirs or assigns, and the said Thomas Sampford shall and may from time to time and at all times hereafter peaceably have hold use occupy possess and enjoy the said tract of one hundred acres of land as aforesaid without any manner of trouble hindrance, molestation, interruption or denial of him the said Michael Purkle his heirs Executors administrators or assigns and of all and every other person or persons whatsoever. And lastly the said Michael Purkle for himself his heirs Executors and administrators the said plantation or tract of one hundred acres of land with the premises and appurtenances therunto belonging unto the said Thomas Sampford his heirs and assigns against him the said Michael Purkle his heirs and assigns and all and every other person or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. South Carolina Greenville County August the seventeenth one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine, Release and release for one hundred acres of land from Michael Purkle to James Sampford, provided by the oath of Benjamin Pollard and Thomas Sampford in open court and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made the twenty third day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and eighty nine, and in the thirteenth year of the Independence of the united States of America, Between Michael Purkle of Greenville County and State of South Carolina planter of the one part and James Sampford of the County and State aforesaid planter of the other part Whereas and by a certain grant bearing date the third day of April One thousand Seven hundred and eighty six and in the tenth year of the Independence of the united States of America, from ^{and} under the hand and seal of his Excellency William Moultrie Esquire Governor and commander in chief in and over the said State, and the great seal of the said State for that purpose appointed did give and grant unto the said Michael Purkle a plantation or tract of two hundred acres of land situate lying and being in the district ~~of~~ ^{of} ninety six above the ancient boundary line on both sides of Reedy River, bounding on all sides on vacant land when surveyed and both such shape form and marks as appears by a plat thereof to the said grant annexed as in and by the said ~~plat~~ ^{plat} and grant duly recorded in the Secretary's office of the said State in book 199 page 382 reference
