

about half a mile above the Town House being part of a tract of land granted unto the s<sup>t</sup> John Molin by letter Patent bearing date the Twenty First day of Januay one thousand Seven hundred and eighty five and in the ninth year of the Independance running and sounding as follows viz: beginning at the mouth of mill Creek and running thence by a conditional line to a Sycamore Tree thence to the Et<sup>t</sup> leine near a station white Oak thence the course thereof to a corner Red Oak 14<sup>th</sup>. thence w<sup>t</sup> to a station Chestnut 55<sup>th</sup> thence along the lower corner 19<sup>th</sup>. to an ash tree w<sup>t</sup> 13<sup>th</sup> to a poplar station thence 8<sup>th</sup> to a corner Red Oak thence N<sup>e</sup> to a Hycory 20<sup>th</sup> thence 5<sup>th</sup> to a stake being a small off set N<sup>e</sup> thence to the South bank of Mill Creek and so bearing N<sup>e</sup> running down v<sup>d</sup> Creek to the begining being by estimation one hundred acres &c the same more or less together with all and singular the woods, ways, waters, water-courses, buildings, improvements and appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining, and the Reversion and Accessions, Remainder and Remainders, Rents & dues and profits therefrom unto the said Nathaniel Bonnen and to his Heirs and assigns for ever free and clear from all former Sales Mortgages, Judgments Executions dowers and Rights and all other Incumbrances, whatsoever pecably and quietly to possess and Enjoy the afores<sup>t</sup> tract of one hundred acres of Land being now in the possession of the s<sup>t</sup> Nathaniel Bonnen Subject nevertheless to such Rents dues & profits as shall become due and payable unto the chief Lord or Lordes the fee to have and to hold the s<sup>t</sup> bargained premises of one hundred acres of Land above described unto the proper use and behoof of him the said Nathaniel Bonnen his Heirs and assigns for ever and the s<sup>t</sup> John Molin his Heirs Exe<sup>t</sup> Adm<sup>r</sup> shall and will warrant and for ever defend as well in equity as in Law the above described tract or parcel of Land unto the s<sup>t</sup> Nathaniel Bonnen his Heirs Exe<sup>t</sup> Adm<sup>r</sup> and assigns from all and every other person or persons laying any lawful claim therunto In witness whereof the s<sup>t</sup> John Molin hath hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal the day and year first above written.
