This 21st day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety one between Joseph Dunklin of Greenville County state of S^t Carolina of the one part & William Mulligan Jun^r of the state afores^t Planter of the Other part witnesseth that the said Joseph Dunklin for & in consideration of the sum of one hundred Pounds current Money of S^t Carolina unto him in hand paid by the s^t William Mulligan at & before the sealing & delivery of this presents the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge thereof & every part thereof do for ever exonerate & acquit of discharge the s^t William Mulligan his Heirs Exec^t & adm^r by these Presents as Grand Bargain & all have Granted Bargain & sold aliened enfeoffed Released & confirming by these presents do Grant & Bargain & sell alien enfeoffed Release & confirm unto the s^t William Mulligan his Heirs & assigns a certain Plantation or Tract of Land containing two hundred & forty acres situate in Greenville County on the waters of Horse Creek Bounding on East by Jesse Chandler's land & all other sides Vacant & not known when surveyed which s^t Plantation or Tract of Two hundred & Forty acres of land the same more or less was Originally Granted by his Excellency William & Moultrie Esq^r Governor of the State afores^t unto Charles Sullivan by Grant bearing date the first day of May 1786 & hath such shape form & marks as a plat thereof to Original Grant annexed Represents Reference thereunto being had will more fully appear together also with all & singular the Rights members Liberties & privileges Improvements hereditaments & appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining of the Reversions & Remainders Rents & issues profits therof; also all the estate Right Little Interest use possession property claim & demand whatsoever of him the s^t Joseph Dunklin in law equity or otherwise howsoever of into or out of all & singular the premises & every part thereof to have & to hold all & singular the premises hereby Granted with the appurtenances unto the s^t William Mulligan his Heirs & assigns to the Only proper use Benefit & behoof of the s^t William Mulligan his Heirs & assigns for ever of the s^t Joseph Dunklin doth by these presents warrant & forever defend the same In witness whereof he hath hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first above written.
