


This Indenture made this First day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy one of the Independence of the United States of America the fourteenth between Henry Wood of the state of South Carolina and Greenville County of the one part and William Brown of the state and County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Henry Wood for and in consideration of the sum of Forty five Pounds sterling Money to him in hand well and Truly paid by the said William Brown at & before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof the said Henry Wood doth hereby acknowledge he the said Henry Wood hath Granted bargained and sold Alien and Confirmed and by these presents doth Grant bargain and sell alien and confirm unto the said William Brown his heirs and assigns for ever a certain Tract or parcel of Land containing Ninety acres situate in Greenville County on the south of Enoree River beginning at a maple corner on the River from thence Running south to a red Oak corner from thence South East to post Oak station from thence to a post Oak corner from thence North to a red Oak station from thence to a stake on the River from thence along the River to a Maple the beginning corner together with all Woods Trees, waters watercourses profits commodities Appurtenances and hereditaments whatsoever thereunto belonging to have & to hold the said Tract & Ninety Acres of land all & singular the Premises above mentioned unto the said William Brown his heirs & assigns for ever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said William Brown his heirs and assigns for ever and the said Henry Wood for himself and his heirs the said Tract nine & twenty Acres with the appurtenances and every part thereof against him and his heirs and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever to the said William Brown his heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and for ever defend by these presents In Witness whereof the said Henry Wood hath hereunto set his hand and seal the day and date first above mentioned
