George Woolf being proven before Sam^l. Earle Esq. by the oath
of John M^ofee was Recorded this 23rd day of June 1794
This Indenture made this Twentieth day of August in the
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three
and in the Seventeenth year of the Independance of United
States of America Between John Reaves of the County of
Spartanburgh and State of S^c. Carolina of the one part and
George Woolf of the County and State aforesaid of the other part
Witnesseth that the said John Reaves for and in considera-
tion of the sum of thirty pounds Sterling to him in hand
paid before the sealing and delivering of these presents the
receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge hath granted bar-
quined and sold and conveyed and by these presents
do confirm unto the said George Woolf his heirs Ex^{ts}. Admt.
or assigns for ever all that tract or plantation of land lying
and being on George Woolfs Creek waters of the middle fork
of Saluda River Beginning at a stake on the said George Woolfs
land Running N^o 40^o W 37-50 to Stake thence N^o 72^o E 18-20 to
a sower wood, thence S^o 42^o E 30-00 to a stake, thence S^o 18^o 48^o
13 to the beginning containing fifty eight acres by the same
more or less, being Tract of land which was granted by his
Excellency Thomas Pinckney unto the said John Reaves as will
shew by a Grant bearing date the 7th day of March in the
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty
seven Together with all woods Trees timber commons advan-
tages hereditaments ways waters and appurtenances
whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any otherwise appur-
taining and also the reversion and reversions Remainder
and Remainders rents and Services of said premises and of
every part thereof and all the estate right Title Interest or
demand whatsoever of him the said John Reaves of in or to
the same to have and to hold the said tract of land and
all and singular the premises above mentioned and every
part thereof with the appurtenances unto the said George
Woolf his heirs and assigns for ever, and the said John
Reaves for himself and his heirs the said Tract of land
