The following Deed of conveyance from Robert Gilliland to Reuben Tarrant being proven before Robert Maxwell Esq. by the Oath of David Whizney was Recorded this 7<sup>th</sup> April 1775  
This Indenture made this tenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety four between Robert Gilliland of the State of South Carolina & County of Greenville of the one part & Reuben Tarrant Junior of the other part & State & County aforesaid Witnesses that said Robert Gilliland for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred pounds of money to him in hand well & truly paid at & before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath & do hereby bargain sell & deliver & convey unto Reuben Tarrant aforesaid his heirs & assigns for ever all that plantation or tract of land whereon William Gilliland now lies containing two hundred acres more or less bounded Northwardly on lands laid out for James Blasingame & S. East on lands laid out for Robert Gilliland & West on Saluda River being part of a tract of land of nine hundred acres Originally Granted to James Nicholson beginning on a small pine, thence running with John Powers line 24-50 ch. to a light wood Stake corner, thence 70 ch. to a Hickory corner on the river thence down the river 26 ch. to a Black oak corner near Rosemans upper corner, thence 22 ch. to a pine corner (Rosemans corner) thence with
