

The following Deed of conveyance from William Armstrong to Jonathan Ward being proven before John Blasingame Esq: by the oath of Joseph Benson was presented & recorded this 11 Day of August 1795

This Indenture made the 8th day of June 1795 between William Armstrong of the State of South Carolina & Greenville County of the one part & Jonathan Ward of the s^d State & County afores^d of the other part Witnesseth that the s^d William Armstrong for the consideration of one hundred pounds Sterling Money to him in hand p^d by the s^d Jonathan Ward the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted & sold unto the s^d Jonathan Ward part of a certain Tract of Land situate in Greenville County on the waters of the Golden Goose Creek & Saludy River containing one hundred Acres more or less it being part of tract of Land originally granted to the s^d William Armstrong the fifteenth day of October one thousand seven hundred & eighty four by his ex^{cell}ent Benjamin Guverard Esq: beginning at red Oak Corner Judge Pendletons line near the branch ^{Money} by a line of Marked trees agreed on by the parties to the mouth of Henry Paris Spring ~~branch~~ thence up the meanders of the main branch to William Brashers line thence ~~thence~~ ^{thence} N. 45 E. 106. along Williams Brashers line ~~thence~~ to a corner agreed by the parties thence S 45 E 106. with a line of Marked trees to the head of the indigo Dam branch thence Down the meanders of the s^d Branch to a oak corner on the original line thence S 45 W with the s^d line to the beginning, containing one hundred Acres more or less & the s^d William Armstrong will warrant & defend to him the s^d Jonathan Ward his heirs &c. all that tract of Land within the above mentioned bounds free & clear from any my mess & from all & every person or persons whatsoever Tax ^{able} ~~part~~ ^{part} the same I have hereunto set my hand & seal the Day & ~~part~~ ^{part} above Written.
