256 The following Deed of Conveyance from James McElyea to John  
 Barnhill being proven before Baylis Earle Esq. by the oath of Daniel  
 Flanery was presented and Recorded this 4<sup>th</sup> day of June 1796  
 This Indenture made this twenty fifth day of September in the  
 year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety six  
 and in the Twentieth year of the Independence of the united States  
 of north America between James McElyea of the State of South  
 Carolina and county of Greenville of the one part, & John Barnhill  
 of the State & county aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that  
 the said James McElyea for and in consideration of the sum of  
 thirty three pounds Sterling Money of the State aforesaid to him the  
 said James McElyea in hand well and Truly paid by the said  
 John Barnhill the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge to  
 be fully satisfied and paid hath given granted bargained & sold & by  
 these presents doth give grant bargain & sell unto the said John  
 Barnhill his heirs and assigns for ever all that Tract or parcel of  
 Land containing one hundred acres more or less situate lying and  
 being in Greenville County & State aforesaid on Brush Creek water  
 of Reedy River Originally granted unto John Hunt and from the  
 said Hunt conveyed to Daniel Flanery by a deed of conveyance bear-  
 ing date the first day of August one thousand seven hundred &  
 ninety three butting and bounding as follows, Viz, beginning on a  
 Maple on the said John Hunts line, thence East to a post oak,  
 thence S. 62 E. to a Hickory near the Head of the region Road branch  
 thence down the several Meanders of the said branch to its conflu-  
 ence with Brush Creek, thence up the said Creek to the mouth of the  
 glade branch, thence up the glade branch to the mouth of Hunts  
 branch, thence up the several Meanders of said Branch to the be-  
 gining Together with all and singular the tenements out houses  
 buildings, ways, waters, water courses, woods & woods Timber  
 and timber Trees fences orchards hereditaments & appurtenances  
 whatsoever thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining
