his heirs and assigns and the said Samuel Mosley doth acquit
and discharge of every part and parcel of the above described
Tract of thirty six acres of land be the same more or less &
lastly of all the said Samuel Mosley from himself his Execu-
tors Administrators & assigns & all other person or persons whatsoever
shall and will for ever warrant and defend the above mentioned
Tract of land unto the s^d William Simson his heirs & assigns in

The following deed of Conveyance from William Clayton to
Matthew Hawkins being proven before William Morgan before
William Anderson was presented & recorded this 11th Jan^y 1797
This Indenture made this 13th day of March in the year of our
Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety four & in the eighteenth
year of American Independency between William Clayton of Greenville
County & State of South Carolina of the one part & Matthew Hawkins
of the County & State aforesaid of the other part, whereas in & by a certain
Grant bearing date the sixth day of May one thousand seven hundred
and ninety three from under the hand of his Excellency William Moultrie
Esquire Governor & commander in & over the State of South Carolina
for the purpose did give & grant unto William Clayton a certain
tract or parcel of land containing five hundred & seventy four acres
situated and lying on Samerons Mill Creek among the little Moun-
tains of the back mountain in Greenville County bounding by lines
run by J^r McChesnes land N.W. & S.W. by Nathaniel Gentry's
