The following Lease and Release from Joseph Meacham & Mary Meacham <sup>329</sup> to William Cox being proven before Thomas Edwards Esq. by the oath of Abraham Cox was presented and Recorded this 18<sup>th</sup> day of January A. D. 1797

This Indenture made the tenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven and in the twelfth year of the Independance of the united States of America between Joseph Meacham of Greenville County and State of South Carolina planter of the one part, and William Cox of the State and County of said planter of the other part Witnesseth that the s<sup>r</sup> Joseph Meacham for and in consideration of the sum of ten pounds Sterling to him in hand well and truly paid by the s<sup>r</sup> William Cox at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said Joseph Meacham hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said William Cox all that plantation or tract of land containing one hundred and one acre or less being and lying in the County of said on a branch of the golden roor Creek waters of Saluda River it being part of a tract of land containing four hundred acres granted unto Benjamin Riev by his Excellency Benjamin Guinand Esq. Governor the fifteenth day of October one thousand
