being drawn before John McElroy Esq^r by the oath of James H.
Elroy was presented and recorded this 22nd day of April 1797
These Indenture made the fifth day of March in the year of our
Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety six between Samuel
Pegg of the County of Greenville and State of S^t Carolina of the one
part and George Seaborn of the County & State aforesaid of the other
part witnesseth that the said Samuel Pegg for and in consideration
of the sum of fifty pounds Sterling Money to him in hand paid by the
said George Seaborn at and before the sealing & delivery of these pre-
sents the receipt whereof the said Samuel Pegg doth hereby acknow-
ledge hath Barg, sold and delivered aforesaid released & confirm'd unto
the said George Seaborn his heirs and assigns for ever a certain plan-
tation or tract of land containing three hundred acres more or less Situate
in the aforesaid County on the head waters of Bakers Creek being part of
a tract consisting of eight hundred & sixty acres Originally granted to
John Kyle by his Excellency Thomas Pinckney Esq^r Governor & commander in
chief of the said State Recorded in Grant Book 16 page 191 Beginning at a
Chesnut thence S 30 E 77-25 to a pine, thence S 75 W 55 to a post oak, thence
N 20 W 79 to a post oak thence on a direct line to the beginning which
tract of land was conveyed by the before mentioned John Kyle to John
Baldwin the thirteenth day of December one thousand seven hundred &
ninety four & convey'd by J. Baldwin to Samuel Pegg the second day of
November one thousand seven hundred and ninety five to have and to
hold the said Tract of land together with all the appurtenances thereto
belonging to the said George Seaborn his heirs and assigns for ever & the
said Samuel Pegg doth hereby warrant and defend him the said George
