Turner's line, thence South thirty seven degrees West to a post oak Saplin on Saluda River, thence up the meanders of the S. River to the begining loge then with all and singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the S<sup>d</sup> premises belonging or in any wise Incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Benjamin Turner his heirs and assigns for ever & I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said premises unto the S<sup>d</sup> Benjamin Turner his heirs & assigns against myself my heirs and against every other person whosoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof as witness my hand & Seal this fourth day of March in the year of our Lord 1794 and in the twenty first year of the Independance of the United States of America

The following Deed of Conveyance from William Turnbough to James Fisher being proven before Robert McAfee Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of Isaac Elledge was presented and recorded this 10<sup>th</sup> day of June 1797

This Indenture made this Eighteen of August one thousand seven hundred and ninety four between William Turnbow & James Fisher both of Greenville County State of South Carolina witnesseth that he the said William Turnbow for and in consideration of the sum of forty pounds to him in hand paid by S<sup>r</sup> James Fisher the receipt whereof he the S<sup>r</sup> William Turnbow doth hereby acknowledge & and himself fully satisfied & made hath granted bargained and sold and conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth fully freely, clearly & absolutely grant bargain sell unto James Fisher his heirs and assigns for ever a certain tract of land whereon he now lives containing one hundred acres and being in the County of Greenville State afores<sup>d</sup> begining as follows at a red oak thence running to a post oak corner, thence to a pine Stake & running to a Condeshon line with Ann Kildbreath Including one hundred acres be the same more or less Together with every right title privilege & emolument to the said land belonging or in any wise appertaining & said William Turnbow doth hereby bind himself his heirs Executors administrators well & truly warrant and for ever defend the aforesaid premises with all the appurtenances to him the said James Fisher his heirs or assigns for ever defend the aforesaid premises free & clear from all Incumbrances and claims whatever in Testimony whereof the said William Turnbow hath set his hand & Seal the day & date above written
