John Justice his heirs administrators and assigns for ever and he the S<sup>r</sup>. William Stroud his heirs Executors Administrators & assigns to hold the S<sup>r</sup>. land and premises free from all person or persons whatsoever laying any lawful wright title claim or demand whatsoever thereto in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal December 11<sup>th</sup> and in the year of our Lord 1796 one thousand seven hundred & ninety six, Seal'd Sign'd & deliver'd in the presence of us John Justice his

The following deed of Conveyance from Richard Hooper to Woody Cantwell being proven before John Blackwell Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of Langston McVay was presented and Recorded this 14<sup>th</sup> September 1797  
 This Indenture made this Twentieth day of January one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven between Richard Hooper of the State of Carolina and County of Pendleton of the one part and Woody Cantwell of the State of South Carolina and County of Greenville of the other part witnesseth that S<sup>r</sup>. Richard Hooper for the consideration of the sum of twelve pound paid by the said Woody Cantwell the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and the S<sup>r</sup>. Richard Hooper has granted bargained and sold unto the S<sup>r</sup>. Woody Cantwell a certain Tract or parcel of land containing fifty acres of land more or less beginning on a post oak running a conditional line to John Cantwell Sr<sup>s</sup> Spring branch, down the said branch to Armstrongs Creek down S<sup>r</sup>. Creek to a maple thence the S<sup>r</sup>. Hoopers Original line to a red oak corner, thence to the beginning, and I the S<sup>r</sup>. Richard Hooper do warrant and for ever defend the above mentioned Tract of land clear from from the claim of any person to the S<sup>r</sup>.
