W. 1/4 chains up the Meanders of Said Creek to a Sweet gum & thence S. 60 E. 3/4 chains to a Red oak 37 thence S. E. 1/4 chains to a stake 37 on bulletts Sullivants Line thence S. W. 60 46 chains on Starling Camps line to the Beginning (Being part of a tract of 400 acres of Land Originally granted unto Mary Milling) Together with all and singular the Rights, and members, Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises Belonging, or in any wise Incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Abner Camp his heirs and assigns forever and I the said Sterling Camp do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises and Every part and parcel thereof unto the above named Abner Camp his heirs and assigns against Myself my and my heirs and against Every person or Persons whomsoever Lawfully Claiming or to Claim the Same or any part thereof as Witness my hand and seal this day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven and in the 22 year of the Independency of America Signed sealed and delivered at the presents of
