The following deed of conveyance from Samuel Nabors to Jacob Nabors being proved before Thomas Cam Esq. by the oath of James Pyley was presented and recorded this 2^d Day of April 1798

This Indenture made the 21st of April 1797 in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven Between Samuel Nabors of the State of South Carolina and Laurence County of the one part and Jacob Nabors of Greenville County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Samuel Nabors for and in Consideration of the sum of fifty pounds Sterling to him in hand paid by the said Jacob Nabors the receipt whereof is here by acknowledged by the said Samuel Nabors hath granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain aliened and confirm unto the said Jacob Nabors his heirs and assigns forever a plantation or tract of Land containing one hundred and twenty acres (be the same more or less) situate in Greenville County lying on a branch of Horse Creek beginning on a white oak BX on William Storices line running thence on Storices line to a stake BX on Spruce meeting Horse branch thence on the same branch up the south fork to a red oak BX thence to the old Indian to a post oak BX thence in the boundary to the beginning on a white oak Being a part of a tract of 996 acres of Land originally granted to the said Samuel Nabors on the first day of January 1789 as is granted Recorded in the Seculars office in grant book 4429 pag 347) Together with all and singular the rights and members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to leave and to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Jacob Nabors his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend the said tract of one hundred and twenty acres of Land (more or less) and all and singular the premises thereunto
