


James Thompson doth for and in consideration of the sum of fourteen Pounds six Shillings and Eight pence Sterling money to him in hand paid by Solomon Littleton at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Receipt thereof is hereby fully Acknowledged & Grant Bargain Sell and Release and Confirm atted by these presents doth grant bargain Sell alien Release and Confirm unto him the said Solomon Littleton him his heirs & assigns forever all that part of a certain Tract Originally granted to William Rice for Six hundred and ninety One acres lying in Greenville County and on Saluda River and signed by Governor Penney on the Second Day of March 1792. Reference there unto will fully appear all that part of a certain Tract of Land beginning at a Gum on Saluda River at the original corner from thence along the original line to a post oak station from thence across a long a conditional line of marked trees untill it interrupts William Abors line to a light wood stake thence along a course line to a Hickory corner on Saluda River thence down & revert to a gum corner to the first station containing fifty acres better or more or less together with all and singular the trees & plants here detamments Rights maners and appertainances whatsoever to the said Tract of Land and premises hereby Bargain and sold belonging or in any wise appertaining and the Reversion and Reversions Remainder and Remainders Rents Issues and profits thereof to have and to hold the said parcel of Land and premises as above described with all and every appertainance unto the said Solomon Littleton his heirs and assigns to his and there only proper use and behoof forever lastly the said James Thompson doth for him self and his heirs agree to and with the said Solomon Littleton that the above described tract or parcel of Land unto the said Solomon Littleton his heirs & assigns against the legal claim of all persons whatsoever shall and will forever Defend as Witness there to the said James Thompson doe hereunto set his hand and affix his seal the day and year first above written signed sealed and Delivered in presents of

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The following Deed of Conveyance from Moses Langley to James Lewis being proven before J. H. Gilgore Esq. by the oath of William Gorman was presented and recorded this 24th Day of June 1798

This Indenture Made this First Day of February in the year of Our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety between Moses Langley of the one part and James Lewis of the other part and both of the State of South Carolina Greenville County Witnesseth that Moses Langley for & in consideration of the sum of Sixty pounds Lawful money to him in hand paid the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath Bargained & sold and by these presents doth Bargain sell alien Release & Confirm unto James Lewis forever all that Tract Plantation or Parcel of Land containing Two Hundred Acres of it being a part of a tract of 412 Acres granted to the said Moses Langley by Patent Bearing Date the fourth day of January 1796 & Recorded in grant Book C. 1st page 222. Situate in the State & County aforesaid on the south side of Rocky Creek waters of Saluda River beginning on a Red oak corner old Marked for John McFerry & runs in James Gochs line S 75° 31' 25" to a Spanish oak 38 m. thence on a New line through said original tract S 18° 44' 50" to a Stake 38 m. on the original line thence S 40° E 9 Chains to a Post oak 38 m. thence S 25° E 14.50 to a Stake 38 m. on Samuel Kellys line thence on said Kellys line N 35° E 27.30 to a post oak old Marked for Sanders thence on Sanders line N 30° E 33.50 to a Red oak 38 thence N 66° 16' 16 chains to the beginning Red oak corner which includes the aforesaid 200 Acres of Land and the said Moses Langley doth Covenant & agree to & with the said James Lewis that the above described 200 Acres of Land is free & clear from any manner of Incumbrance whatsoever and that he the said Moses Langley forever Warrant and Defend the above described Two Hundred Acres of Land together with all & singular the Appertinances & Incumbrances Hereditaments Rents Issues and Profits thereunto belonging or in any
