~~This Indenture made this tenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven between Robert Henry Dumkin of the City of Philadelphia and Eliza Dumkin his wife of the one Part and John Barclay Esquire of the other Part being acknowledged before John D. Cox Esquire President of the Court of Common Pleas for the first District of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania was presented and recorded this 11<sup>th</sup> Day of July 1798.~~

This Indenture made this tenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven between Robert Henry Dumkin of the City of Philadelphia Esquire and Eliza both his wife of the one Part and John Barclay of the same Place Esquire of the other Part witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the sum of Two thousand five Hundred Dollars and lawful money of the United States to him the said Robert at & before the Seal and Delivery here of the receipt whereof is here by acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold aliened in fee simple released and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell alien in fee simple release and confirm unto the said John Barclay his heirs and assigns all these Ten several Tracts Pieces of Land situate lying and being in the State of South Carolina one of them N<sup>o</sup> 1 containing one thousand acres situate in the District of Washington in Greenville County on Gap Creek of the north fork of Saluda River bounded by line running North west and North East
