Governor for the time being did give and grant unto William Davis a certain tract of Land containing two hundred acres situate in Greenville County Bounding as follows on the North East on the South East by vacant Land on the South West by vacant Land on the North West vacant Land and hath such marks as appears by a Plat to said Grant annexed it being duly Recorded in the Secrearys office Witnesseth that the said William Davis for and in consideration of the sum of Sixty pounds
