




In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this ninth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine.

236 The following conveyance from S. O. Kelly to Samuel Earle being proven before Jesse Carter by the oath of Moses Evans was presented and recorded this 4th July 1799 —
 This Indenture made this 7th November 1798 between ~~Samuel Earle~~ S. O. Kelly of the State of S. Carolina Greenville County & Sam^l Earle of the State and County aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said James Charles Kelly for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to him in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged & with which he doth acknowledge himself fully satisfied & paid hath granted bargained & sold & by these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto the said Sam^l Earle 135 acres of land whereon Joseph Wright now lives & purchased by said Kelly of the said Wright as will appear by conveyance from under the hand & seal of the said Wright bearing date the 20th day of this month the said land being part of a tract originally granted to Daniel Kelly & by a survey then of made thereof by George Salmon Esq^r is bounded as follows Viz beginning on a poplar on a branch of the 5th fork of Saluda river running thence N 40^o E 7 chains to a poplar thence S 74^o E 24 chains S 8^o E to a stake thence N 8^o 64^o E 6 chain 25^o S 4^o to a white oak thence N 8^o 64^o E 8 chain 25^o S 4^o to a white oak thence N 7^o 16^o 22 chain 30 Links to a stake thence N 65^o E 3 chain 10 Links to a chestnut thence N 12^o E 9 ch^{rs} 50 Links to a red oak thence N 42^o W 5 chain to a red oak thence N 11^o W 24 chain 50 Links to highwood stake thence S 18^o W 9 chain 60 Links to a red oak thence N 8^o E 2 chain 50 Links to a pine stump thence S 47^o W 13 chain

237 20 Links to a chestnut oak thence S 74^o W 13 chain to a poplar the beginning corner to have & to hold the said land and all the appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining and the said Samuel Kelly for himself, his heirs & assigns hereby warrant & agree with the said Samuel Earle his heirs & assigns that at the time of signing sealing and delivering these presents the said Kelly stands seized & possessed of a good & lawful inalienable title of inheritance in fee simple in the aforesaid land & premises and he doth for this covenants in manner aforesaid for himself his heirs and assigns to and with the aforesaid Samuel Earle his heirs that he will at all times warrant and forever defend for himself, his heirs & assigns unto the said Samuel Earle his heirs and assigns the title of the said land & from them & all manner of other persons or person laying any claim there to in witness whereof he has hereunto set his hand & seal the day & year first written in presence of Samuel Davis, & Moses Evans,

The following Lease & Release from John Woodrope to John Blasingame being proven before Jesse Carter by the oath of John Westfield was presented and recorded this 7th day of July 1799 —

State of South Carolina — This Indenture made the Twentieth day of Feb^y in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety nine & in the twenty third year of the Independence of the United States of America between John Woodrope of the City of Charleston in the State aforesaid Merchant of the one part & John Blasingame of Greenville County in the District of Washington in the State aforesaid planter of the other part witnesseth that the said John Woodrope in consideration of five shillings lawful money of the said State to him in hand paid by the said John Blasingame at or before the sealing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and for other good causes & considerations him the said John Woodrope therunto especially moving hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto the said John Blasingame his Executors Administrators & assigns all that plantation or tract of land situate in ninety six districts above the old Indian Boundary & known by the name Samerons Cowpens containing six hundred & forty acres & at the time of survey being all that tract of land originally surveyed for & granted unto Henry Pinckton the bounded on all sides by vacant lands together with all & singular the Houses outhouses buildings Stables Together with all and singular the Houses out Houses yards gardens Orchards pines
