

1 The following Deed of Conveyance from Baylis Earle of  
Henry M. Wood being proven before Thomas Edwards Esquire  
by the oath of John Blasingame was presented and recorded  
this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of October 1800 —

The State of South Carolina }  
Greenville District — — — } know all men by  
these presents that Baylis Earle of the State and  
District aforesaid in consideration of the sum of Twelve  
Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by Henry M. Wood  
of the District and State aforesaid have Granted bargain'd  
sold and released and by these Presents do grant bargain  
sell and Release unto the said Henry M. Wood all that  
Parcel or tract of Land Containing Three Hundred acres  
lying in the District of Greenville on the North side of  
Pee Dee River known by the name of the Diggin Tract  
beginning on a Red oak near the bank of the River Run-  
ning thence N. 66° E 15 Ch. to a stake, thence S. 82° E. 13. 50  
to a stake by the Road thence S. 30 E. 62. 75 to a Post  
Oak thence S. 66 W. 41. 40 to a Post Oak, thence S. 30 W.  
68. 50 to a stake, on the River thence with the Meanders  
of the said River to the beginning, to Contain Three Hun-  
dred acres - Together with all and singular the Rights  
members Hereditaments and appurtenances to said  
Premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining  
to have and to hold all and singular the Premises before  
mentioned unto the said Henry M. Wood his Heirs and  
assigns forever and I do here by bind my self, my heirs  
Executors and administrators To warrant and forever  
defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said  
Henry M. Wood his Heirs and assigns against my self  
and my heirs and against every Other Person or Persons
