

253 The following Act of Conveyance from James Gray to Archable Dill being proven before Reubin Barrett Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of William Halim was presented and recorded this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of July 1801

State of Carolina, Greenville District

Know all men by these presents that I James Gray of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina and Greenville District for an inconsideration of the sum of two hundred and twenty five dollars to me paid by Archable Dill of said District and state aforesaid I have granted bargained & sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Archable Dill a plantation or tract of land lying in Greenville District aforesaid on the waters of the beaver dam creek of the middle fork of Tiger river adjoining land surveyed for Joseph & Manasse Maxwell on a market road joining land granted to Baylis Carl & Ann Smith the other on vacant land beginning on a red oak running S 20 W to a black oak thence S 25 W 24 to a chestnut stake thence N 60 E 24 to a pine thence S E to a small ash thence E 45 to a post oak thence S 10 W 28 to a small sowerwood thence S 65 W 33 50 to a chestnut thence to the beginning a tract of land granted to the said James Gray by a patent bearing date the seventh day of October in the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine containing by Estimation two hundred and ten acres be the same more or less by his Excellency Edward Rutledge Esq<sup>r</sup> and the said James Gray do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Archable Dill the above described premises together with all and singular the rights members
