468 The State of South Carolina, Know all men by these Presents that I Thomas Beale of Fincastle in the County of Botetourt, and State of Virginia (being fully authorized, constituted and appointed by Thomas Beale as his lawful attorney for and on his ~~and~~ behalf to sell & dispose of the fee simple of certain Tracts of Land therein mentioned to any purchaser or purchasers under the restrictions therein contained which is dated the tenth day of June 1796,) by virtue of the said power and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to me paid by Larkin Tarrant of the District of Greenville in the State first aforesaid HAVE granted bargained sold and released and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Larkin Tarrant, all that Plantation or Tract of Land containing five hundred acres, more or less, Situate lying and being in the District of Greenville & State of S. Carolina, on the Beaver dam Creek waters of Saluda River bounded at the time of the Original Survey by a line running S. W. on William Neals land on all other sides by ~~the~~ Vacant land being originally granted to Elizabeth Beale Wife of Thomas Beale by Patent bearing date the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of May 1785 -
