



at a Stake running a straight line to the Corner of Rachel Roberts ⁴⁷⁹

County and State aforesaid have granted bargained sold
and Released and by these presents do grant bargain sell
and Release unto the said John Dillingham a certain
Tract of land containing two hundred acres lying on the
North branch of Saluda River in Greenville County
and State aforesaid having such shapes and marks as
