South Carolina Know all men by these Presents, that I William Yarbrough of Greenville District and State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of One hundred dollars to me paid by Solomon Loftis of Greenville District I have granted bargain and sold & released, and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Solomon Loftis, a Plantation or Tract of Land lying in Greenville District on Cox Creek of South Tyger River containing Fifty acres, be the same more or less - it being a part of a Tract of Land granted to Archabald Dill, and by said Dill conveyed to James Copeland and said Copeland conveyed to Benjamin West, and West to me, the said fifty acres beginning on a post oak, running 60. W. 45th to a agreed on Chestnut Corner, thence along the conditional line between Gowen & Copeland to a post oak, agreed on by us, thence straight across to the creek a Chestnut agreed on thence down the creek to the mouth of the branch that heads up to the old School house, thence up the said branch on its course to the beginning, Fifty acres more or less - Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments
