

Containing two hundred acres, be the same more or less, lying and being in Greenville District on a branch of Enoree River including the Plantation whereon the said Elisha Simmons formerly lived, it being part of a tract of lands originally granted to the said Elisha Simmons, grant bearing date the Eighth day of November 1794. Beginning on Elisha Smiths line where it crosses Kemps branch, South 1/2 E. to a post oak, thence along a Conditional line "between Elisha Simon & Wm Taylor wad" to a black Oak Elisha Smiths corner, thence along a Conditional line to the beginning at Kemps branch, which said Tract of lands of two hundred acres more or less with all and every of its appurtenances the said Elisha Simmons doth from himself his heirs and from all other Persons with warrant and for ever assign to the said William Taylor his heirs and assigns for ever: In Witness whereof the said Elisha Simmons hath hereunto set his hands and affixed his seal the Day & year above written: No. part of the above land was granted to Isaac Green Entertainer, before assigned —

The State of South Carolina: Know all men by these presents that I James Blasingame of the State of Kentucky in consideration of two hundred and fifty dollars to me paid by John Westfield of Greenville District and State of South Carolina have granted bargain gained sold and released and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Westfield all that Tract or parcel of land lying and being in the District and State aforesaid and on Saluda River the same being two hundred and Fifty Eight Acres a part of a Tract of land Containing Eight hundred Eighteen Acres Originally granted to said James Blasingame on the seventh of August seventeen hundred & eighty six, and the two hundred and Fifty Eight acres meant to be conveyed runs as follows viz: Beginning on a Hickory corner and from thence S 76 E. 40 chains to a post oak &c. thence S 45 W. to a black oak
