This Indenture made the tenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and four and in the twenty seventh year of the Independence of the United States of America between William Staten of South Carolina Greenville District of the one part and Thomas Young of the State & District aforesaid of the other parts. Witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars paid to him in hand paid by the said William Staten hereby acknowledged the said William Staten hath granted bargained sold and conveyed & by these presents do grant bargain sell & convey to the said Thomas Young his heirs Executors administrators or assigns all that tract or part of Land Beginning on a black oak Co. thence to a dogwood Co. & upon Beaumonts old line thence to a stake corner thence on the S. line to a Stake corner thence on the S. line to a stake Co. to white walnuts Co. thence to a beach on a Conditional line to a red oak Co. thence to a white oak Co. to a point on the Creek thence down said Creek to a black gum Co. thence to Chestnut Co. & thence a Conditional line to the beginning lying on both sides of oyl Camp Creek branch of middle fork of Saluda containing one hundred acres more or less Now I the said William Staten do for myself my heirs Executors administrators or assigns hereby do warrant and defend the said premises above mentioned unto the S^r Thomas Young his heirs and assigns from all persons or persons lawfully Claiming or to Claim the same In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this the tenth of September one thousand Eight hundred and four.
