The State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I George French of Greenville District in the State aforesaid Farmer, in consideration of one hundred Dollars to me paid by Arthur Clark of the district and State aforesaid Farmer, Have granted bargained sold & released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Arthur Clark all that part of a large tract of 1823 acres Originally Granted to Miles Jennings by his Excellency William Moultrie on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of April 1786 lying on the waters of Sabudae river, as by a plat thereto annexed will more fully appear, Beginning at a white Oak in the fork of a branch and running S. N. 75.° to a stake on the Original line thence S. E. 10.° on the old line 14 Chs. to a white oak corner near a branch thence S. W. 30.° 10 chains to a Pine oak corner thence S. E. 50.° on the old line 36 chains to the old road leading from Peares ford Sabudae to the tumbing. & so also by river at forks of a branch thence up the meanders of the said Branch to the Beginning white oak corner Containing one hundred acres be the same more or be it less, Together with all and singular the rites members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in (any)
