 Greenville District : of the State & District aforesaid in consideration of two hundred
 dollars to me paid by Tho. Rice of the State & District aforesaid have granted & bargained sold
 & released and by these presents do grant bargain sell & release unto the s^d Tho. Rice a plantation
 and part of two original tracts one granted to Obey Bishop on the 5th day of June 1785 -
 thence conveyed to said Gallathan now from J^r Gallathan to s^d Rice part of the tract -
 Beginning at a post oak running N. 60 W 22 ch. 50 lks to a post oak thence S. 30 W. 40 to a
 lightwood Stake thence by a conditional line down a branch to the little Ruge fork thence
 down s^d creek to a hickory thence to the Beginning. Including by estimation Eighty five
 acres of Land more or less. The other tract originally granted to Drury Smith on the 5th day
 of June 1786 thence convey'd to Gallathan now from J^r Gallathan to s^d Rice part
 of the tract Beginning at a hickory running thence S. 55 W. 26 to a post oak thence S. 5
 E. 21. 6th ch. 50 lks to lightwood Stake thence N. 30 to a post oak new made thence to the Beginning
