The State of South Carolina, Know all men by these presents, that I John Archer
 of Greenville District in the State aforesaid. for and in Consideration of the sum of
 one hundred Dollars to me ^{in hand} paid by Elizabeth Paul of the same District, Have
 bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said
 Elizabeth Paul one Negro boy named Jacob about nine or ten years old - which I
 do warrant and defend unto the said Elizabeth Paul her heirs and assigns
 forever against myself my heirs & every person whomsoever. Nevertheless it is the
 intentions of the said parties and is hereby mutually Agreed that whereas the said
 John Archer hath this day borrowed a certain sum of money, to wit, one hundred
 Dollars of the said Elizabeth Paul. and in order that the said Elizabeth may be
 kept safe and sure of the payment of the said sum of money the said John doth
 hereby mortgage unto her the above mentioned Boy - Now if the said John Archer
 shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Elizabeth Paul her heirs
 Exec^{rs} or adm^{rs} the said sum of one hundred Dollars at any time within Twelve
 months from this date with Lawfull Interest thereon then the above bargain
