 Have granted bargained sold & released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell
 release & confirm unto the said Josiah Culbertson all that parcel and tract of land
 whereon he now lives) containing three hundred acres be the same more or less -
 Being part of a tract of Eight hundred & Twenty two acres granted to the said
 Wm. Thomas) Beginning at the mouth of the rocky branch just below the mouth of
 clear creek, on the S. bank of S. Tygar river, running up said Branch to the head
 thereof thence S. 5° W. to the back line of said tract, thence E. along said line to a
 Post oak corner N. 26° E. 90 Ch. to a pine corner to George Salmon, N. 85° E. 20 Ch.
 to a Stake corner to J. B. E. Elkins N. 35° W. to the said River & up the meanders of the
 south Bank thereof to the Beginning. Together with all & singular the rights, members
 hereditaments & appurtenances to the said three hundred acres belonging in any
 ways appertaining, To have & to hold the premises above mentioned unto the said Josiah
 Culbertson his heirs & assigns forever, & I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & Administrators
 and assigns to warrant & forever defend all the said three hundred acres of land
 above mentioned to the said Josiah Culbertson his heirs & assigns from every
 other person or persons whatsoever laying any lawfull claim thereto -

 thousand seven hundred & ninety four & of the independence of the United States of America

 of the one part & Samuel Brafford of the T. County State aforesaid of the other part
 Witneseth that the said Harris Mullins for & in consideration of the sum of thirty seven pounds
 ten shillings Sterling money to him in hand paid by the said Samuel Brafford the
 receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that he the said Harris Mullins Hath ren-
 = gaged & sold & by these presents doth bargain & sell unto the said Saml. Brafford his heirs
 & assigns forever, a certain tract a parcel of land containing three hundred acres
 be the same more or less lying being in the County aforesaid on the branches of Saluda
 River & the Golden Grove creek, it being part of a tract formerly surveyed for John Auger
 which being slaps has since been granted to the said Harris Mullins which said tract
 of land is bounded by the lands of the said Brafford George Banksley Mary Sowell
 Alexander McKinney William Payne lands unknown & many more which said tract
 of three hundred acres be the same more or less, with all & every of its appurtenances the
