

354 This Indenture made the twenty fifth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three Between George Salmon of Greenville County and State of South Carolina of the one part and James Tedlock of the County & State aforesaid of the other part.

Witnesseth that the said George Salmon for and in consideration of the sum of five shillings sterling Money to him the said George Salmon in hand paid by the said James Tedlock the Receipt whereof is hereby Acknowledged

He the said George Salmon hath granted bargained and sold and by these Presents do grant bargain sell alien and convey unto the Said James Tedlock all that Plantation or tract of Land containing one hundred and thirty two Acres be the same more or less, Situate in Greenville County aforesaid on both sides of the Middle Fork of Saluda River Bounding on John Brandon to the south west all other sides on Vacant Lands at the time of the Original Survey being made and being as followeth, That is to say, Beginning on a Spanish Oak on the south side of ^{the middle fork of} Saluda River John Brandon's Corner Running thence North fifty three Degrees East thirty six Chains to a white Oak thence South thirty six degrees East forty Chains to a stake thence South six Degrees East twenty three Chains to a stake on John Brandon's line thence to the Beginning = Together with all and singular the woods, trees, Tithes, Commons, Advantages, the Easements ways waters and appurtenances whatsoever there to Belonging or in any wise appurtenant, and also the Reversion &

Reversions, Remainders and Remainder Rents and services of the Premises and every part thereof and all the Estate Right title Interest or demand whatsoever of him the said George Salmon of in and to the same, To Have and To hold the said tracts of Land and all and singular the Premises above mentioned and every part thereof =
