 the said State & District of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Thomas Chatman
 for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and thirty dollars lawful
 current money to him in hand well and truly paid by him the said
 William Stinson as and before the delivery of these presents the receipt whereof
 is hereby fully acknowledged hath granted a bargain and sale aforesaid
 Release confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien
 Release and confirm unto him the said William Stinson his heirs and
 assigns forever all that part of a certain tract of land containing six
 hundred and ninety acres originally granted to William Reed and signed
 by Governor Pinckney on the second day of March 1792: as by a plat
 thereunto annexed will fully appear all that part of the said tract of land
