Senior of Greenville District in the State aforesaid for and in Consideration of three
hundred & fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Nathaniel Walker of Spartanburg
District in the State aforesaid, I have Granted bargained and Sold and by these
Present do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Nath. Walker all that
tract or plantation of land supposed to contain three hundred acres be the same man
or less. The same being apart of a tract of five hundred acres Originally granted
to John McHaffey by Patton bearing date the 4th day of January 1793: and
Recorded in Grant book F. N. 5. Page 459 & also twenty five acres Conveyed by James
Lewis to Reuben Smith Senior the seventh of September 1801. The Land to be
Conveyed is all the land Included and Conveyed by Reuben Smith Junr. to Reuben
Smith Junr. by a conveyance bearing date the 4th of Sept. 1801. Including the
Plantation whereon Reuben Smith Junr. family lived Intitute in Greenville District
in the State aforesaid on the head of the Long Branch of Rocky creek waters of
Enoree River. Together with all and Singulars the right members hereditaments &
appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise Incident or appertaining —
To have and to hold all and Singulars the premises before mentioned unto the said
Nathaniel Walker his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself & my
heirs Executors and Administrators To warrant and forever defend all and Singular
the premises before mentioned unto the said Nath. Walker his heirs and assigns
against every other person whom ever lawfully claiming or to claim the same
in any Part thereof —
