

Parcel or tract of land I bought of Alexander Waddill (being a part of a tract of four hundred acres granted to John Timmons and bearing date 15<sup>th</sup> October 1784. and by him conveyed to Nathaniel Stokes) containing sixty acres more or less. Beginning at the branch on the lower line at a stake thence South 45: Wt. 33. Chain to a stake corner with the race ground thence N. 60. Wt. 21. Chain 50 links to a small black oak on a stone line then N. 10. E. 20. Chain to a Persimmon tree, at the said branch near James Pritchards old path to the courthouse then down the said Branch to the Beginning. Together with all the rights & appurtenances belonging thereto. to have and to hold unto the said Jonathan West his heirs and assigns forever, And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors &c. to Warrant and defend forever, the aforesaid Plantation or tract of land of sixty acres unto the said Jonathan West his heirs and assigns and against myself my heirs and every other Person claiming the same or any part thereof - Witness my hand and seal this 7<sup>th</sup> day of December 1805 -

Wood and William Wood of Greenville District and State aforesaid. for and in consideration of Three Hundred Dollars to us in hand paid by Patrick Moore of the State & District aforesaid. Have bargained sold and released and by these Presents do Grant bargain sell and release unto the said Patrick Moore part of a certain tract of Land whereon the said Rich<sup>d</sup>. Wood & Wm. Wood now lives lying on Beaver dam creek waters of Enoree River, on the south side of said creek containing one hundred and fifty acres - Beginning on Enoch Bensons line on said creek thence up the meanders of the Creek to the old line, of said tract. thence out a long said line as far as to include one hundred & fifty acres laying next to said creek including the Plantation whereon the said Rich<sup>d</sup>. Wood and Wm. Wood now live. its being a part of a tract of land of six hundred and forty acres Originally granted to Moses Wood - Together with all and singular the rights members
