Joining lands Surveyed for Mathias Silver now the property of John Gowen which said tract contains by Estimation one hundred acres. and bounded as follows Beginning on a post oak running thence N<sup>E</sup> 85° West 85 chains to a white oak, thence South 15 chains 22 links to a Hickory thence East 68 chains 82 links to a Post oak thence to the Beginning — Together with all and singularly the rights members hereditaments and appurtenance to the said Premises belonging or in any wise appertaining — To Have and To Hold all and singularly the Premises before mentioned unto the said Benjamin West aforesaid his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said Benjamin West and to his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against all and every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
