the rights members Accoutrements and appurtenances to the said premises  
belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, To Have & To Hold all  
and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Daniel Richardson his  
heirs and assigns forever, And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and  
administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises  
before mentioned unto the said Daniel Richardson his heirs and assigns against  
myself and my heirs, and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming  
or to claim the same or any part thereof. I Witness whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand and affixed my seal this 5<sup>th</sup> of May 1804.

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This Indenture made this twenty-fifth day of December in the year of our  
Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven and in the twenty first year  
of America Independence, Between James Peck of the State of South Carolina  
Greenville County of the one part, and Abel Richardson of said County and State  
of the other part, Whereas in and by a certain Grant of one thousand acres of  
land, granted to James Wafford Situate & lying in said County on Guilders  
creek water of Ennee river, and bounded westwardly by Hoop's & said Peck's  
land, and eastwardly by Ruckers & Austins land & hath such shape & marks  
as are by a plat unto the said Grant annexed, Now this indenture Witnesseth  
that the said James Peck for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred & fifteen  
Dollars to him in hand paid by the said Abel Richardson, the receipt is hereby  
acknowledged, that he the said James Peck is well contented satisfied and paid  
and hath granted bargained and sold and by this presents doth Grant bargain  
and sell unto the said Abel Richardson, one hundred acres of said tract of land —  
Beginning at a black oak corner on the old line near W<sup>m</sup> Richardson son, and runs  
Westwardly a conditional line, to the long branch of Guilders creek and corners on a  
poplar & thence the various courses of said branch to the said creek & crosses the
