Carolina Greenville District; Be it remembered that on the 29th day of October 1807: Benjamin Townsend came personally before me and made oath in due form of law and saith he was present and did see Ambrose Blackburn sign and affix his act and deed deliver the within deed of conveyance for the use and purposes therein mentioned, and that he and the other witnesses with himself subscribe their names as witnesses to the same — Sworn to and subscribed the day and date above written.

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The State of South Carolina, Know all men by these presents that I John Blaptingame of Greenville district in the said State for your consideration of the sum of fifteen Hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Robert Fleming of Charleston and State aforesaid, Have granted, bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell & release unto the said Robert Fleming his heirs and assigns all that plantation or tract or parcel of land situate in Greenville district lying & being on the waters of Reedy River on the N.C. side of said river containing five hundred and eighty acres be the same more or less originally granted in four different grants to wit, one grant of one hundred acres granted to Isaac Bruce on the 6th day of March 1786 one other grant for one hundred and sixty acres granted to said Bruce on the 4th of August 1786 one other grant for two hundred and forty four acres granted to said Bruce on the 5th of November 1792 one other grant for one hundred and thirty eight acres granted to Daniel Wilbanky on the first day of December, 1794 and conveyed from said Wilbanky to Bruce, & all the above said tracts or parcels of land conveyed from said Bruce to me on the 10th October 1804. all which said tracts or parcels of land are adjoining each other and are included in the following Lincetown, Beginning at a Stake corner running S. 65° W. 40 chains to a black oak, thence N. 25° W. 40 chains to a red oak, thence N. 30° W. 40 chains to a Stake, thence N. 60° E. 25° chain to a Stake & thence N. 75° E. 50° to a Stake thence S. 26° E. 66° 50° to a red oak & thence S. 80° E. 32° Chain to a Hickory, thence with underwoods has a south west course to the Beginning. Together with all & singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all & singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to the said Robert Fleming his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & administrators to warrant and forever defend all & singular the said premises unto the said Robert Fleming his heirs & assigns against myself & my heirs & all & every part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this nineteenth day of February and in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and eight, and in the thirty second year of the independency of the United States of America —
