The State of S. Carolina Greenville District, Know all men by these presents  
that I William Chambers, of the District and State aforesaid, have granted and  
delivered unto friend Thomas Benson his heirs and representatives in trust for  
the only use and behoof of my beloved Wife Jenny Chambers, all & singular  
the Estate which I am now in possession of consisting of Land, Stock, of Cattle horses,  
Plantation utensils, household and kitchen furniture also hogs sheep Geese  
Poultry of every kind, all the corn fodder & every thing I am now in possession  
of, To have and To hold the above Estate for the use and benefit of my wife Jenny  
Chambers without the hindrance <sup>or molestation</sup> of one or any other persons or persons, during  
her natural life & at her death I mean my wife Jenny Chambers that she  
shall be at liberty to dispose of it as she may see cause and that it may be clearly  
understood I mean that my whole Estate shall be and to belong to her during her  
life and to dispose of as she may see cause — Given under my hand and  
seal this 25<sup>th</sup> November 1807 — Done in presence of

John Burns, William Maxwell — William Chalmers Esq<sup>r</sup>  
S. Carolina Greenville District, Personally appeared before me William  
Maxwell and made oath as the law directs that he saw William Chambers sign  
and execute the within deed of Trust and that he saw John Burns sign his name

dollar to me in hand paid by Thomas Benson of Greenville district and State aforesaid  
have granted bargain and sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release  
unto the said Thomas Benson his heirs or assigns a plantation or tract of Land contain-  
ing one hundred and sixteen acres more or less, situate in Greenville District on the  
branch of Enoree River Beginning on a white oak at a Shoal in said Enoree thence  
N. 30. E. 75. to a red oak, thence N. 60. W. 18. 75. to a stake near the fork of a small  
branch thence up the W. fork of s<sup>d</sup> branch to an ash thence N. 64. W. 12. 50 to a light  
wood stake, on a path thence along s<sup>d</sup> path till it intersects Blackwell's line, thence  
N. 65. W. 14. 50 to a stake, thence a conditional line to head of a branch thence down
