Know all men by these presents that I James Wifford of the State of South Carolina Spartanburg District for the consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to me in hand paid by William Forester of Greenville District the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, to be satisfied and paid, and for the said sum, I do hereby grant bargain and sold, and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said William Forester to him his heirs Exec^{rs} adm^{rs} or assigns one hundred acres of land, situate lying on the branches of Guilders Creek the waters of Enoree river, Beginning at Stake on Pechy line running S. 70. W. 13. chain 50 links, to Stake then S. 77. chain 25. links, to Stake then N. 76. W. 18 chain 30 links, to red oak, then S. 5. E. 19. chain 50 links, to a maple by a branch then up a small fork of said branch N. chains to red oak then N. 2. W. 25. chain to pine then N. 77. W. 12 chain 75 links, to black Jack then N. 17. chain to pine stump then S. 76. E. 40 chains to the beginning; to include all in said bound, for one hundred acres of land let there be more or less Together with all the premises and appurtenances, then unto belonging to the only proper use and behoof of him the said William Forester him his heirs Exec^{rs} adm^{rs} or assigns forever, and be the said W^m Forester him his
