W. 25. 30<sup>th</sup> to a post oak thence N. 66. W. 8. to a post oak thence S. 60. W. 17. to a post oak thence N. 84. W. 13. 40<sup>th</sup> to a stake thence N. 5. E. 19. 90<sup>th</sup> to a stake thence N. 08. W. 4. 50. to a red oak thence N. 5. W. 10. to a stake thence N. 9. W. 4. to a white oak on barrel branch thence N. 00. W. 10<sup>th</sup> to a poplar thence N. 45. E. 28. to a white oak on horse creek thence down said creek S. 04. E. 14. 50. to a black oak on Robert Bollings line thence S. 35. E. 17. to a black oak thence S. 45. W. 9. to a stake thence down said creek to the beginning white oak.
