

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The State of South Carolina Greenville District, Whereas Millington
Easley late of the District and State aforesaid, deceased departed this life
on the _____ day of _____ in the year of our Lord one thousand
Eight hundred & _____ intestate, being at the time of his death possessed of
a certain plantation or tract of land, Situate lying and being in the District
aforesaid, on Saluda river, containing four hundred & Eighty acres. And Whereas a
Petition exparte the Representatives of the said Millington Easley to the Honorable
the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas, praying that a writ of Partition might
issue, directed to certain Commissioners, therein named to lay out the distributive share
of each of the said representatives, or in case that could not be done with convenience
to all parties therein concerned, then and in that case to recommend a Sale
thereof, agreeable to an act of the General Assembly of the said State, in such case
made and provided - In Obedience to which writ of Partition the Commissioners
aforesaid, viewed the premises above mentioned, and made return of the said writ
that they were of opinion the lands could not be divided without Manifest
injury and inconvenience to all the parties concerned therein, or entitled to
a distributive share thereof, and recommended the same should be sold to the
highest bidder - Whereupon it was ordered by the said Court of Common
Pleas at Greenville Court House that the Sheriff of the said District, do advertise the
lands of the said Millington Easley as intended by the Commissioners named in the
said writ to be sold, and ^{that} he do sell the same on the first Monday of the next
 ensuing May on a credit of twelve months, to the highest bidder, taking bond
with approved security, and mortgage of the premises, to secure payment -
