This Indenture made this 2^d day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and Eight Between (John Holland of the State of South Carolina & Greenville
District of the one part, and Walter Jacobs of the State of said of the other part. Witnesseth
that the said John Holland for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars to
him in hand paid by the said Walter Jacobs the receipt of which the said John Holland
doth hereby acknowledge, he the said John hath granted, bargained and by this Present
doth grant bargain and sell and confirm unto the said Walter Jacobs his heirs & assigns
forever, a certain Tract of Land containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less, being
part of a Tract granted to Ulrich Connor by His Excellency Mr. Moultrie Esq. Situate in
Greenville district South side of Enoree river, beginning on a hickory on Kemp's branch
running up said branch bounded with land laid out for George Rufel Connor on a
Black Oak running up a little branch to a Stake, thence running a S.W. course to a
hickory, thence running a S. course to a poplar corner on the mire branch, thence down
said mire branch to where it empties into the cane brake branch, thence the various
courses of the branch down to a Dogwood corner, thence a W. course to a Black Oak
Corner, thence a N. course to a pine, from the pine corner to a little branch, up said
