Ether about fifteen years old, which s^d three negro Slaves we do warrant
to be sound healthy and sensible, and clear and free from any incumbran-
or impediments whatsoever, and will warrant and forever defend the s^d three negro
women Charlotte Sylla & Ether, and their increase unto the said George W. Earle
