 hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or
 in any wise incident or appertaining, To have & to hold all and singular
 the premises before mentioned unto the said H. J. Walker His heirs and
 assigns forever, and I do bind myself my heirs executors & administrators
 to warrant and defend forever, all and singular the said premises unto
 the said H. J. Walker His Heirs, &c. against myself my heirs &c. and
 against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim
