Maxwell's land, and running NNE 22° 40' to a pt. oak, on Mr Bowens land
thence S. 16° W. 31° 50' to a red oak on Philip Evans land thence S 16° E. 10' to a Spanish
oak, on s^r Evans line, thence S 57° E. 27° 45' to a red oak on Evans line, thence N. 42°
E. 18° across the creek, to a hickory corner, on George Terry's land, thence S 48°
E. 2° to a hickory on the branch thence up the meanders of said branch to
a white oak, at the head of s^r branch, thence S 75° E. 22° 50' to a pine corner
