Burns all that tract or parcel of land containing one hundred acres, situated in
Greenville District & State aforesaid, on the heads of Taylors & Morgans branch, waters
of Enore River, including the spot where the Greenville & Buncombe roads
cross, also where George Culbertson formerly lived, the same being a part of
a tract of five hundred acres originally granted to Henry Hughes February
5th 1784. bounding on John Wheelers wife Morgan Wm Taylor Joseph M. G. Langh
